With Concessions Secured, Board of Education Places 5-year Emergency Levy on November Ballot

Following a year of major reductions in staffing, increases in pay-to-participate fees and reductions in service, the Medina City Schools' Board of Education voted at its regular monthly board meeting on July 19, 2010 to place a 5-year Emergency Levy on the Nov. 2, 2010 ballot.

School Board President Mark Dolan explained that the Board of Education participated in many in-depth conversations at

its monthly work sessions regarding the course to take knowing that the district is facing a budget deficit of close to \$3.4 million in 2011 and \$8.8 million in 2012. The Board discussed various options such as a continuous operating levy, an income tax, and an

emergency levy.

Dolan stated that the issue with an income tax is that the district would not fully collect the funds generated for 18 months.

Recognizing the district's current financial situation, this would not provide the necessary funds that are needed immediately. However, the Board will continue discussions regarding an income tax for the future when the district's finances are sound.

"What we are most proud of is that so many residents came and spoke with us, provided their input and helped form the decision moving forward," Dolan said. "You spoke and we listened. Our community wanted personnel to share in the sacrifice and our employees,

stepped up."

The Board discussed the pros and cons of a continuous operating levy and an emergency levy prior to their vote. The major differences between the two are that an emergency levy is for a fixed amount of money and for a

High school freshmen get a great start with Link Crew program

Medina High School incoming freshmen have the opportunity to participate in an orientation program to familiarize them with the school, opportunities, and to meet their peers. On Friday, Aug. 20, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., students will kick off the school year with a fun filled educational orientation.

The orientation day is planned and organized through the Link Crew program. Link Crew is a student centered leadership and mentoring program. The guiding principle that sustains Link Crew is that there is an invaluable resource that is integral to its success and that is students. This program engages, develops, and trains upper classmen to be leaders and mentors to incoming freshmen.

Incoming freshmen will be personally invited to attend the orientation day by a Link Crew Leader who spends the day with them and mentors them throughout their first

year at Medina High School. Link Crew goes beyond the orientation. Freshmen and their mentors will participate in a number of activities together throughout the school year from a football game social, a fall academic follow-up, Cocoa, Cookies, and Cram in January prior to exams, a spring academic follow-up and another social.

Assistant principal Joel Morgan stated, "Link Crew helps change school culture. The student body becomes more connected, more spirited, and kinder to each other. Because of the diversity of the leaders, Link Crew gives students who would otherwise not socialize with each other a common purpose and a common goal."

Link Crew Leaders are trained and assisted by staff members at Medina High School who have been trained for this program.

finite period of time; while a continuous operating levy collects some additional revenue on new construction where an emergency levy does not. The school district treasurer stated that the county auditor's office suggested that the district plan on zero dollars for new construction for 2011 and a minimal amount for 2012 and 2013.

The 5-year emergency levy would collect approximately \$7 million dollars each of the five years. The cost to a homeowner for every \$200,000 home value would be \$30/ per month.

Pertussis Sickens Hundreds of Ohioans Every Year



Pertussis – also known as whooping cough – sickens hundreds of Ohioans every year, and the Medina County Health Department wants to help you protect yourself and your loved ones from this vaccine-preventable disease.

The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) recommends children be vaccinated with the tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis vaccine at two, four, and six months of age; again at 12 to 15 months of age; with an additional dose at four to six years of age. Because protection can weaken over time, a booster shot of the diphtheria, tetanus, and acellular pertussis (Tdap) vaccine is recommended between 11 and 12 years of age. While all adults need a tetanus booster every ten years, adults less than 65 years of age who have not had a booster with a pertussis containing vaccine, such as Tdap, should receive Tdap the next time a booster is due. There are vaccines licensed for individuals 10 to 64 years of age.

Pertussis is spread when a patient coughs or sneezes while in close contact

with others, who may then inhale the bacteria. The disease is similar to the common cold at first, followed by severe coughing after one to two weeks. Children often experience violent, rapid coughs, followed by a “whooping” sound – hence the name whooping cough. People with these symptoms should see their physicians right away, as antibiotics can limit the spread of disease.

Pertussis kills an estimated 10 to 30 Americans every year, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Most deaths are in infants 12 months of age and younger. Ohio reported 346 cases of pertussis in 2001; 441 in 2002; 328 in 2003; 885 in 2004; 1,094 in 2005; 594 in 2006; 837 in 2007; and 845 in 2008. Pertussis is under-diagnosed. In the early stages, when pertussis is most contagious, the illness resembles a common cold. Many people with pertussis are not diagnosed, so the actual number of cases is probably much higher.

Please note that all sev-

enth graders entering school in the State of Ohio during 2010 will be required to have received a single dose of Tdap. A single dose of the vaccine is also recommended for all other adolescents who have not yet received Tdap vaccine or Td booster, and adults 19 to 64 years of age. It is especially important for those who have direct contact with infants 12 months of age and younger, such as parents, grandparents, childcare providers, and healthcare workers.



Concessions and Levy Approval Would Show a Shared Sacrifice

Employees Open Contracts

In response to the school district's current financial situation and the recent lay-off of close to 160 employees (100 being teachers), the teacher's union (MCTA) membership voted to make concessions in their current contract, including additional contributions to their healthcare contributions and a decrease in base salary raise for the 2010-2011 school year. These concessions total approximately \$1,000,000 for the upcoming school year.

"Our parents, students and community members expect an excellent school district," said Superintendent Randy Stepp. "I very much appreciate the generosity and understanding that the teachers have shown. Times have been

tough for everyone in our community and our teachers recognize that. Teachers are good-hearted people who care about our community and the community's children. We are all in this together and I truly appreciate the gesture and good faith effort being made by our teachers."

Administrators Also Step Up

Administrators took voluntary cuts in January, including paying 15% of their healthcare costs for the remainder of the 2009-10 school year. For the 2010-11 school year, administrators will freeze their base pay and any merit pay, and continue to contribute 15 percent

toward their health care costs.

The administrators decided to pay a percentage, instead of a set dollar amount, for the increase in their healthcare premiums recognizing that healthcare costs do increase from year-to-year and are helping the district reduce expenses.

Cuts and Concessions Lower Millage Amount

Due to cuts and concessions, the Board of Education placed a 5.9 mill Emergency Levy on the November ballot that, if approved, will cost an additional \$30 per month for every \$200,000 in property value. The Emergency Levy will only last five years, unless reapproved by voters.

"I hope our community recognizes the sacrifice our employees made," said Board President Mark Dolan. "They didn't have to do this, but they really stepped up. And, approximately 50% of our employees live in our district so if the levy passes they will also be sharing in the sacrifice to provide an excellent education for our students."

Important Information about the November 2 Emergency Levy

If levy passes the District can:

- Prevent layoffs of an additional 50-70 quality teachers
- Maintain class sizes at same size
- Reduce pay-to-participate fees 50% (performing arts, athletics and clubs)
- Reinstate transportation services to previous levels
- Keep current academic programs and electives

Even if the levy passes, we can't bring back all the cuts made during the 2009-2010 school year.
