Scheduling 2012-2013

Registration for the 2012-2013 school year courses will begin on February 2, 2012 through February 12, 2012 for students currently in grades 9-11 and on March 22, 2012 through March 30, 2012 for students currently in grade 8.

The school's registration guide contains information and procedures which will enable students and their parents to make appropriate course selections for the coming year. Several steps should be taken in order to ensure that course selections meet your needs and comply with the Board of Education adopted graduation requirements. The registration guide will be available for viewing on February 2, 2012 only through your student's Blackboard account.

Timeline for students in grades 9-11:

- **February 2, 2012** – Spring Registration begins at Medina High School through Blackboard. Students are to review the general information and registration procedures. Then determine the required courses for your upcoming grade level using the indicated prerequisites to schedule appropriately. Next, determine the elective courses you may be interested in taking by referring to the description of courses for details. Again, check the prerequisites. Students entering grades 10 and 11 must schedule for 5 courses each semester. Students entering grade 12 may schedule for the minimum required courses for graduation. Remember to consider eligibility requirements for athletic purposes (five ½ credit courses per semester).

Discuss individually with your current teachers and school counselor your selections for the upcoming year.

Discuss with your parents your selections.

Request your course selections through your PAM account.

Assistance will be available at school to access your PAM account Wednesday and Thursday, February 8 and 9 in the Media Center from 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m..

All requests must be entered prior to midnight February 12, 2012.

- **February 7, 2012** – Post Secondary Education Options Meetings. 2:30-4:00pm in the Middle Auditorium. This is a mandatory meeting for students and/or parents who are interested in pursuing PSEOP for the 2012-2013 school year. Continuing PSEOP students do not need to attend. (Note: Representatives from University of Akron, Cuyahoga Community College and Lorain Community College will be at the meeting.)
- **February 21-March 30, 2012** – Students will meet individually with your school counselor to review your Spring Registration request.
- **April 10, 2012** – Final Teacher Recommendations. Students will receive Individual Course Plans containing previous courses, grades and requested courses for the 2012-13 school year. Teachers will verify appropriate registration. Individual Course Plans will be collected and returned to school counselor.
- **April 13, 2012** – End of Spring Registration. Student initiated schedule changes will not be accepted after April 13, 2012. Student schedules will be developed according to Spring Registration Requests.

Scheduling 2012-2013 *continued*

Timeline for students in grade 8:

- **March 13, 2012** – Students will receive registration materials through presentation in Language Arts by high school counselor. Review the general information and registration procedures. Then determine the required courses for your upcoming grade level using the indicated prerequisites to schedule appropriately. Next, determine the elective courses you may be interested in taking by referring to the description of courses for details. Again, check the prerequisites. Students entering grade 9 must schedule for 5 courses each semester. Remember to consider eligibility requirements for athletic purposes (five ½ credit courses per semester).
- **March 15, 2012** – 8th Grade Parents' Night 7:00-8:00pm Performing Arts Center. Parents are to bring scheduling material that students received. The presentation is similar to the presentations given in the students Language Arts class; students need not attend.
- **March 16, 2012** – 8th grade teachers will be distributing Spring Registration Cards with course recommendations for Language Arts, Math and level II World Languages. Discuss with your parents your selections.
- **March 22-23, 2012** – **Claggett Jr High School request your course selections through your PAM account.** High School counselors will assist students using their PAM accounts in the computer lab from 7:40am-2:40pm. Parents are welcome to register with their student during study hall or lunch. All requests may be accessed through PAM accounts until March 30th. Spring Registration Cards will be collected from the student.
- **March 26-27, 2012** – **A.I. Root Jr. High School request your course selections through your PAM account.** High School counselors will assist students using their PAM accounts in the media center from 7:40am-2:40pm. Parents are welcome to register with their student during study hall or lunch. All requests may be accessed through PAM accounts until March 30th. Spring Registration Cards will be collected from the student.
- **April 13, 2012** – End of Spring Registration. Student initiated schedule changes will not be accepted after April 13, 2012. Student schedules will be developed according to Spring Registration Requests.

If you follow these steps carefully, read the material closely and ask the advice of your counselor and teachers, then you should be in a good position for enrolling in courses that will meet your current and future needs.

- Simple search interface to quickly find an answer to your how-to question.

We will be using Atomic Learning as a user driven initiative, which means that when you want to know how to do virtually anything with technology you can access your own personal account through Atomic Learning and watch a tutorial that will walk you through the technology. With Atomic Learning you can watch a video on something as basic as Spell Check in Outlook Web Access 2010 on a PC to working with modules in Blackboard 9.1 to shading graphs on a TI-84 calculator. Atomic Learning covers BoardMaker, Kurzweil, Office, iPads and much much more.

Financial Aid/Scholarship Information



Scholarship information is continually being updated on the student's Blackboard account under the Guidance Organization. Please note that the most recently added scholarships are found at the bottom of the list. The Medina High School/Medina County Local Scholarships will start being available sometime in February. The "universal application" scholarship opportunity will be live on the Blackboard account starting February 22 until March 9.

Here are some statistics regarding total financial aid monies awarded to college students: 80% has some tie with the Federal or State government in the form of need-based financial aid. 18% comes directly from the colleges, mostly in the form of scholarships, most of which are renewable. Only 1-2% comes from privately sponsored scholarship programs, most of which are NOT renewable. Therefore, be sure you consult the colleges regarding scholarship opportunities.

ALL college bound seniors should complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) as soon as possible after January 1. "College Goal Sunday" will be held on Sunday, February 12, 2012 at 2:00 pm. The program is available at most of the local colleges, including CCC West, LCCC, U of Akron, and Kent State. Financial aid professionals from Ohio colleges and universities will be available to coach families through the FAFSA application. You will need to take parents' and students' previous year IRS 1040 tax returns and W2's, Social Security Cards and Driver's Licenses, along with other previous year income and benefits information. Registration is required. Consult the website www.studentaid.org or www.oasfaa.org or phone 1-877-428-8246.

Consult www.fasfa.ed.gov to complete the FAFSA. The best method is to complete the Fed-

eral 1040 forms first, but parents can use estimated figures OR last year's tax figures if necessary. Both student and parent will be asked to create a PIN (Personal Identification Number). Even if a family does not qualify for need-based aid, the FAFSA is a necessary step in the process to apply for the lower interest college bank loans. The federally sponsored STAFFORD and PLUS loans are typically the easiest and cheapest way to secure funds for college. Home equity loans are also popular options. A discussion with a personal financial planner is often helpful. Some private colleges require an additional form, the Profile Financial Aid Application. Consult the website at www.collegeboard.com.

Parents of sophomores/juniors should consider accessing the FAFSA4caster at www.FederalStudentAid.ed.gov to get an early start on the financial aid process.

Avoid scholarship scams. It is NOT necessary to pay anyone to locate scholarships or student aid for your college bound student. Information is readily available from the library, the internet, and college financial aid offices. For scholarship searching, consult www.fastweb.com or www.scholarship.com. Another good search can be completed via www.google.com. Start out with a general listing and then add modifying words such as "freshman" or "Ohio" or "female" to narrow your search.

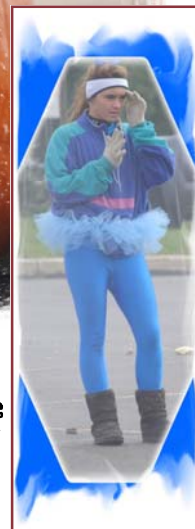
Remember to consult with the college or university financial aid office if you have special circumstances or specific questions. Also, as mentioned above, it may be advisable to meet with your financial planner to map out the best way to meet college costs. Most colleges will provide you with a "financial aid package" in March or April so that you and your senior can make decisions before the May 1 deadline.

Watch deadlines. Due dates are set for a reason. Usually sponsors will not consider late applications.

Pumpkin Launch 2011

This was the Ninth Annual Pumpkin Launch and about 160 students participated. All the wet weather we've had prompted a move for the event to the Marching Band Parking lot, but it didn't hinder the fun. In the end, the Red Army defeated the Blue Army 705 to 650.

Physics teacher Doug Smith explains that there are two purposes of the event. First, it gives the students a chance to apply physics learned in the classroom to a large-scale project that involves teamwork and competition. Second, the event promotes awareness of physics and enrollment in both our physics and AP physics courses.

Mr. Smith was pleased that the students raised about \$1350 for a military family as they sought donations for the cause while they were in the process of building their machines.

He noted that enrollment in physics went up 40% the first year after the Pumpkin Launch started. For him, a fun element of the event is to see the young children from the elementary school who come to watch. It is especially satisfying to have students who were spectators years ago now in his class.

On November 16, 2011 MHS Media Center participated in **Library Snapshot Day**. Libraries across the state participate in data collection for one day in their library. The information is collected to help provide a realistic image of what goes on in a typical library day.

On Nov. 16, 409 students came to the library for study hall, lunch or other free time. Over 130 students used the library computer lab for class, and over 110 students utilized the computers in the library.
